The dog will not touch me. The dog may bark to communicate with the security team.

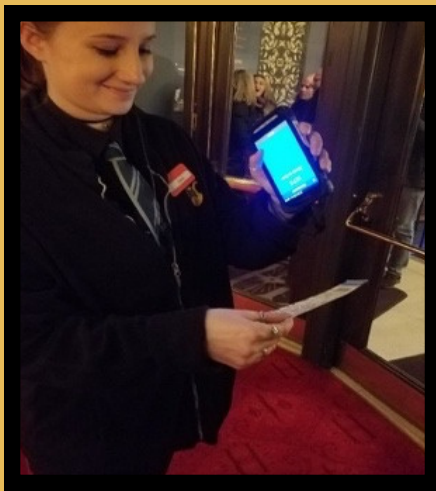
An usher will scan my ticket so I can get into the theatre.

I may use the restroom on the way to my seat or at any time during the show.

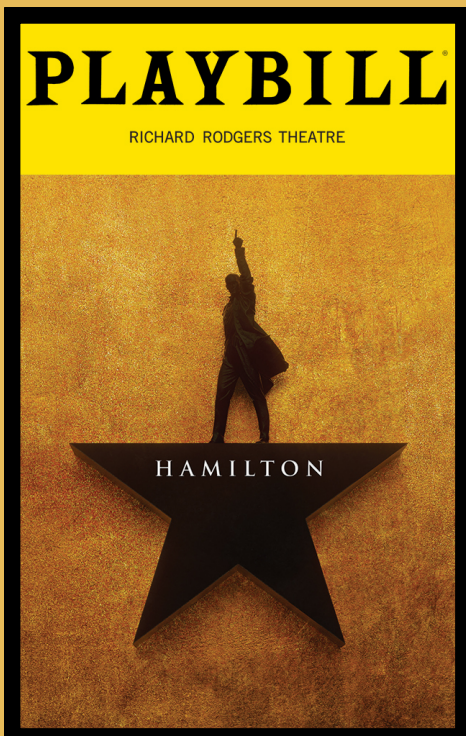
All restrooms are family restrooms.



TICKETING & SEATING

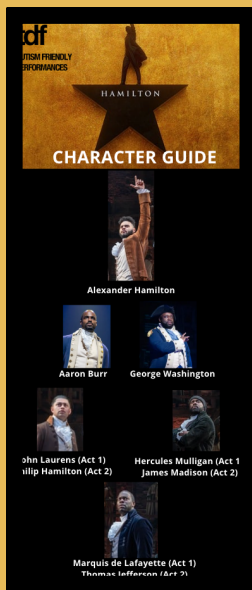
I will give my ticket to the usher so they can show me where my seat is. The numbers on the ticket let me know where my specific seat is.

VISUAL SUPPORTS

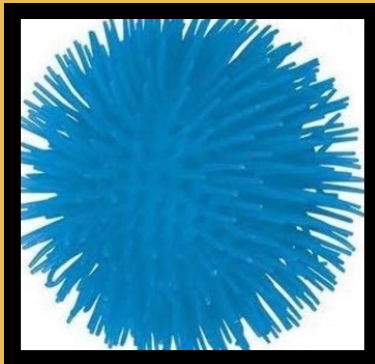
TDF Volunteers will be passing out visual supports.

THE PERFORMANCE



The theatre will become dark and quiet so the audience may experience the sounds of the show.

The actors wear costumes when performing. This helps them pretend to be the characters they are portraying.

The actors will not touch anyone in the audience.



BREAK AREAS

If the show is ever too loud or too bright, I may take a break in one of the Break Areas. In these areas, there are bean bag chairs and mats that I may sit or lay on.

When I am ready, I may go back into the theatre to experience the show!



SHOW LENGTH

The show is 2 hours and 45 minutes.

This includes a 15-minute intermission, a break during the show.

CLAPPING



The audience may clap during and at the end of the show.

Clapping lets the actors know that the audience likes their performance.

If the clapping is too loud, I may ask a TDF volunteer for ear plugs or headphones to help make it quieter.

When the performance has finished, the audience will leave the theatre.
