WHERE: MINSKOFF THEATRE

200 West 45th Street, New York City (between 7th and 8th Avenues)

WHEN: PERFORMANCE BEGINS at 1:00pm


DOORS OPEN at 12:00pm

RUNNING TIME is 2 hours and 30 minutes, including one 15-minute intermission

## **GETTING INTO THE THEATRE**

- You can come into the main entrance through 44th or 45th Street.
- Theatre doors will open at **12:00pm**, so you will have to wait in line by the main entrance breezeway until then.
- You will pass through security and will be asked to present your ticket to be scanned.





- There is an escalator or a set of stairs to access the main lobby.
   Then, there will be another escalator or set of stairs to get to the orchestra and mezzanine levels.
- If you need to use the elevator, please inform a member of the house staff or a TDF volunteer upon entering, and they can help point you in the right direction.
- All seats, with the exception of wheelchair and companion seats, require steps to access. An usher will help show you to your seat(s).

## **PHOTOGRAPHY**

- Photography and Videography are NOT PERMITTED inside the theatre. We want to enjoy the show while still respecting the theatre's policies.
  - TDF will have a professional photographer on site taking flash photos to be used on social media sites.
  - Please let the photographer know if you do not want your family or group's picture taken.

  - There is NO CHARGE for having your picture taken at the show and these photos are FREE for you to download from TDF's Facebook page.

- Assistive listening devices are available for use. Please see a guest experience representative upon arrival to arrange.



- **Break Areas** will be positioned in the lobby areas on each level of the theatre. They will be staffed with trained professionals and are accessible throughout the performance.
- All restrooms at this performances are **Family Restrooms**. Volunteers will be able to guide you to their locations.
