Below is important information to support your show experience.

FAST FACTS

WHERE: CIRCLE IN THE SQUARE THEATRE
235 West 50th Street between Broadway and Eighth Avenue in Manhattan

WHEN: PERFORMANCE BEGINS at 1 p.m.
LOBBY OPENS at 12:10 p.m.
THEATRE OPENS at 12:25 p.m.

RUNNING TIME is 2 hours and 30 minutes including a 15-minute intermission

VENUE WARNINGS



- This musical is an immersive experience. There is some audience participation, and there will be actors performing in the aisles. Theatre staff will give warnings to stay seated and keep hands and especially feet away from the aisles.
- Due to actor movement in the aisles, there is limited mobility throughout the theatre during the performance.
- Actors move in and out of the theatre and lobby spaces throughout the performance. If you exit the theatre, you may be asked to wait to reenter for safety purposes.

CONTENT WARNINGS

- During one scene, an actor aims and shoots a prop gun at the ceiling.
- This show contains strong language, including profanity.
- Characters experience and discuss alcoholism.
- Characters die in the show, but death is not depicted onstage.
- During a scene in which two characters are filming a movie, one slaps the other.
- Those seated close to the action may be impacted by actors' sweat and spit.

GETTING INTO THE THEATRE

The Circle in the Square box office level is accessible without steps from the street at 235 West 50th Street. The theatre is under a canopy adjacent to the Gershwin Theatre. To find the correct entrance, look for TDF Autism Friendly Performances signage.



You will be asked to wait in line outside until the doors open at 12:10 p.m. The theatre itself will open at 12:25 p.m. It's possible these times may be delayed a few minutes depending on the production's needs.



You will be taken through security and asked to present your tickets for scanning.





There is an escalator down to the theatre from the box office level.

An elevator is available through the adjoining building. Please ask a theatre staff member for assistance.

Wheelchair accessible and companion seats are located in the back of the orchestra.

If you need to use the wheelchair accessible restroom, please ask a theatre staff member for assistance. You will be escorted to the adjoining building and taken by elevator to the accessible restroom.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Photography and videography are **NOT PERMITTED** inside the theatre. We want you to enjoy the show while still respecting the theatre's policies.

- TDF will have a professional photographer on-site taking flash photos to be used on social media.
- Please let the photographer know if you do not want to be photographed.
- There is no charge for having your picture taken. These photos will be available to download for free from TDF's Facebook page at facebook.com/tdfnyc a few days after the performance.
- While photography and filming are not allowed during the performance, **communication devices are permitted**. Theatre staff members are trained to recognize the difference between filming and using communication devices.

TOOLS

- Some fidgets, earplugs, and a limited number of headphones will be available at the performance.
- Personal small supports (e.g., fidgets, sunglasses, and headphones) are allowed in the theatre.
- If you are planning to bring a service animal to the performance, please notify us in advance at autism@tdf.org.
- Assistive listening devices are available for use. Please see a guest experience representative at the theatre upon arrival to arrange.



SPACES

- **Break Areas** will be available in the theatre lobby downstairs. They will be staffed with trained professionals and are accessible throughout the performance. **Due to limited audience mobility during the show, Break Areas may not be as easily accessible as they are during other Autism Friendly Performances.**
- All restrooms at this performance are **Family Restrooms**. Volunteers can guide you to their location downstairs in the lower lobby.
- A **wheelchair accessible restroom** is available. Please ask a theatre staff member for assistance.



PEOPLE

Just in Time Staff

- In order to provide a supportive, autism-friendly environment, TDF holds training sessions for the entire Circle in the Square Theatre staff.

TDF Volunteers

- TDF has trained volunteers, many of whom are professional autism specialists, assisting the house staff (e.g., ushers, security team). They are available throughout the performance to provide assistance.
- Break Areas will be staffed with TDF volunteers who are autism specialists.
- Additional trained volunteers will be accessible throughout the performance to offer assistance.

Parents and Caregivers

- Parents and caregivers are responsible for their care receivers at all times. Our trained volunteers are prepared to help however they can.
