- The show features confetti, pyrotechnics, smoke effects, flashing lights, and drones that are used to represent fairies.
- There are live animals in the show including camels and various farm animals.



GETTING INTO THE THEATRE

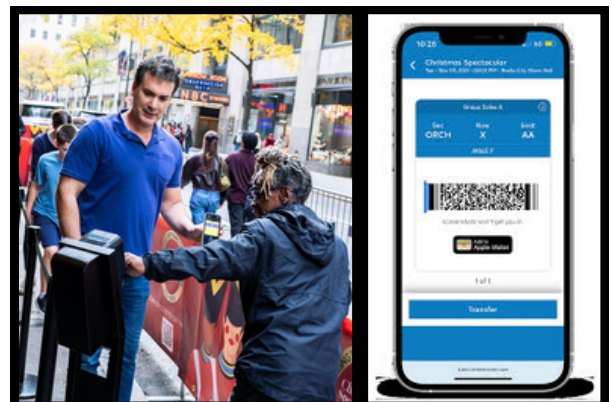
There are multiple entrances at Radio City Music Hall. The accessible entrance is located under the marquee on the corner of 50th Street and Sixth Avenue.



You may be asked to wait in line outside until the doors open at 8:30 a.m. The house staff will let everyone in as soon as they are ready to seat the audience.



You will be taken through security and asked to present your electronic ticket for scanning.



The orchestra is accessible without steps.



The first mezzanine is up one flight of stairs and seats require steps to access.



All floors are accessible via elevator.

Wheelchair accessible restrooms are located downstairs in the Grand Lounge.



PHOTOGRAPHY

Photos and videos are **NOT PERMITTED** inside the theatre. We want you to enjoy the show while still respecting the theatre's policies.

- TDF will have a professional photographer on-site taking flash photos to be used on social media.
 - Please let the photographer know if you do not want to be photographed.
 - There is no charge for having your picture taken. These photos will be available to download for free from TDF's Facebook page at facebook.com/tdfnyc a few days after the performance.
- While you are not allowed to take photos or videos during the performance, **communication devices are welcome**. Theatre staff are trained to recognize the difference between filming and using communication devices.

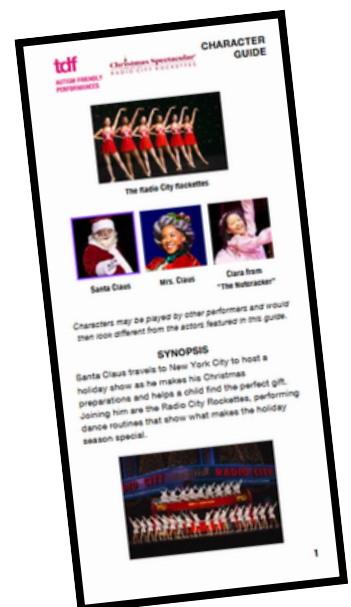

TOOLS

- In addition to fidget tools provided by TDF, Radio City Music Hall has partnered with KultureCity to improve its ability to assist and accommodate guests with sensory needs. Sensory bags containing special KCVIP badges, fidget tools, noise-canceling headphones, and other resources are available to borrow at no cost by leaving an ID at the Guest Services Desk in the Grand Foyer.
- Small personal supports (e.g., fidgets, sunglasses, and headphones) are allowed in the theatre.
- Assistive listening devices are available. Please see a guest experience representative at the theatre to arrange.
- If you are planning to bring a service animal to the performance, please notify us in advance at autism@tdf.org.



SPACES

- A **Break Area** will be located downstairs in the Grand Lounge. It will be staffed with trained professionals and is accessible throughout the performance.
- Family/all-gender restrooms are available at Radio City Music Hall. Please see an usher or guest experience representative on-site for directions. Caretakers may provide personal assistance as required.
- **Wheelchair accessible restrooms** are also available downstairs in the Grand Lounge. These are also Family Restrooms.



PEOPLE

Christmas Spectacular Staff

- In order to create a supportive, autism-friendly environment, TDF has provided training sessions for the entire cast and Radio City Music Hall staff.

TDF Volunteers

- TDF has trained volunteers, many of whom are professional service providers experienced in working with individuals on the autism spectrum. These volunteers assist house staff (e.g., ushers and security personnel) and are available throughout the performance to offer support and assistance.
- Break Areas will be staffed with TDF volunteers who are autism specialists.
- Additional trained volunteers will be accessible throughout the performance to offer assistance.
- While many volunteers are trained autism professionals, they are not authorized to provide therapeutic services in this environment. Parents and caregivers are solely responsible for their care receivers at all times.
